

ASBESTOS NOTICE

In 1986, the Congress passed the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act to address the risks of asbestos in the nation's schools. As a result of that act, the Gentry School District and all other schools in the country underwent a detailed inspection to discover any and all asbestos that might be in our buildings. Following that inspection, the District developed a "Management Plan" to deal with any problem areas that were found.

The Gentry School District's Management Plan is on file in the administration office. All interested persons are invited to view the district's plan at any time during regular school hours.

Because the amount and type of asbestos found in the Gentry Schools poses little or no threat to the health and safety of students, staff and public; no asbestos abatement activities are planned for the foreseeable future. The District is committed to a long term Operations and Maintenance Program to keep the identified asbestos in a non-threatening condition.

The District is further committed to providing a six-month periodic surveillance to assure that no change in the condition of the asbestos threatens the building occupants.

The Gentry School District intends to comply with all the provisions of this law, and any other law, that guarantees the health and safety of all who use the district buildings.
