We placed one 4th grader, one 5th grader, one 6th grader, and two 11th graders from teacher and public referrals in December.

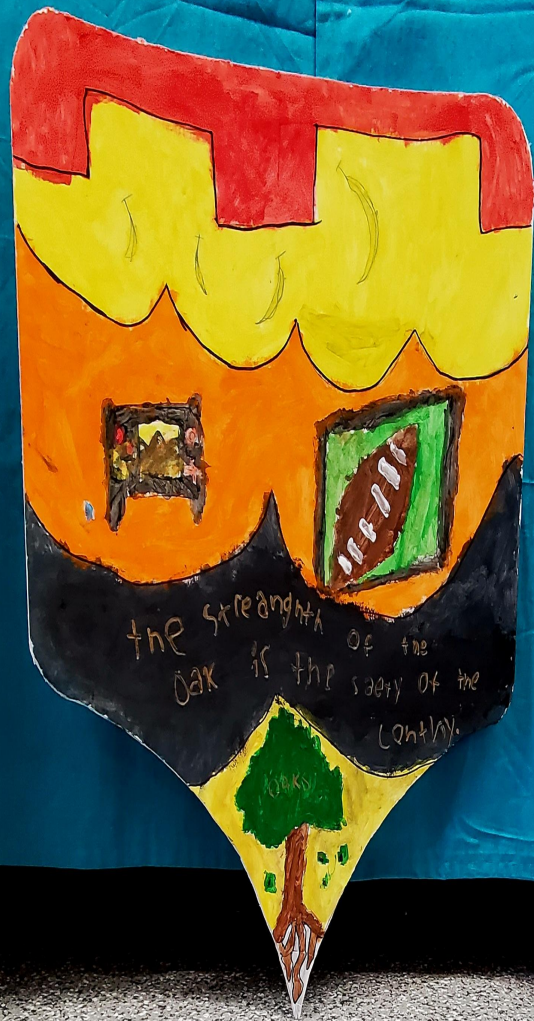
We universally screened 2nd graders and will look to place in August for the 2023-2024 school year.
